

for most pounds of food collected during this time. We will be kicking this off at worship with more details about which weeks we will be focusing on which food to bring in.


We will begin with peanut butter though for sure! Bring your peanut butter this week.



Join Bishop Lanette Plambeck and the Minnesota Conference Appointive Cabinet in a Lenten study around the book "**The Third Day,**" by Bishop Tom Berlin.



From the publisher:

On the third day, he rose again.

In *The Third Day: Living the Resurrection*, Tom Berlin uses his gifts of storytelling and understanding the Scriptures to connect the reader to the experiences of several individuals around Jesus in his final days, focusing on new life and redemption rather than loss.

Join Peter, Mary Magdalene, and Thomas as they feel the despair of losing Jesus and the surprise and joy that awaits them in the resurrection. This study traces events around these characters, along with Paul and the disciples at Emmaus, and how the resurrection transforms their lives.

The book can be read alone or used for a six-week group study and churchwide Lenten program. Components include a comprehensive Leader Guide and video teaching sessions featuring Tom (with closed captioning).

For Lent, Pastor Jen will be using this book as a loose guide for a series of messages.



Beginning in January 2025, **Bishop Lanette Plambeck invited** clergy and laity across the Area to join in a journey through Luke and Acts, reading one chapter each week throughout the year.

March Breakthrough Prayer

Bishop Lanette will offer a new breakthrough prayer each month throughout 2025, inviting the Holy Spirit to form and transform us through this communal reading experience. She encourages us to pray the prayer daily. The March prayer is:

Holy and Mighty God,

You have called us to follow you—to deny ourselves, take up our cross daily, and walk in the way of Jesus. Yet too often, we hesitate. We cling to comfort instead of courage, to control instead of trust, to complacency when we are called to challenge the sin of this age. But you are the God of abundance, the One who multiplies loaves and fish, who sends out disciples with nothing yet provides everything, who teaches us to engage ministry with boldness and expectancy.

Lord, we seek your kingdom first and your righteousness. Therefore: Break through our fears with the power of your Spirit. Break through our doubts with the assurance of your love. Break through our complacency with the urgency of your mission. Teach us to trust you, to give us a way to walk forward in faith, knowing that you are already ahead of us.

Jesus, let our hearts be set on fire with the passion of your gospel. Let our lives be marked by generosity, humility, and holy boldness. Let your will be done in us and through us—on earth as it is in heaven.

May your Spirit move in ways beyond what we can ask or imagine. And when you call, Lord, may we answer, "Here I am, send me."

In the name of Jesus, our Savior and Guide, we pray. Amen.
